ANNUAL ACTION PLAN - PRE MATRIC SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME FOR SOCIALLY AND EDUCATIONALLY BACKWARD STUDENTS 2020-21

The Pre-Matric Scholarship Scheme for Students belonging to Socially and Educationally Backward Classes for studies in India is a 100% Centrally Sponsored Scheme being implemented through the State Government and Union Territories and has been in operation since 1998-99. The objective of the scheme is to provide financial assistance to the OBC students studying at pre matriculation or secondary stage. The scholarships are awarded through the State Government/UT Administration to which the applicant belongs to, i.e. permanently settled, for study in recognized institutions. The scheme is an open- ended scheme and the current eligibility conditions are (i) parental income from all sources should not exceed Rs 2.5 lakh p.a. and (ii) the institution should be a recognised one as per the scheme guidelines. State Governments and Union Territory Administrations are sanctioned Central Assistance (CA) at par with Notional Allocation as conveyed at the beginning of Financial Year. The scheme runs on sharing pattern of 50:50 (Central:State).

2. Although many SEBC students have availed benefits under this scheme and have secured admission in post-matriculation institutes/organisation, still the Gross Enrolment Ratio of SEBCs in higher education lags behind the national average (25.8%). It has been the endeavour of Government to raise the admission percentage of SEBCs in higher education after completing secondary stage.

Target for 2020-21

3. The State- wise targets (taken as per average of previous years' records) and their tentative notional Allocation for 2020-21 has been given at **Annexure I.** These targets are only indicative targets and State can propose higher or lower target depending on their specific circumstances/requirements.

Plans at the State level

4. The Notional Allocation (NA) under the Scheme as given in this plan has been done in proportion to their total population as per census. The States are requested to prepare their Annual Action Plans showing the number of students proposed to be covered under the scheme, the eligibility, guidelines and the systems for disbursement and monitoring.

Modalities of implementation

5. <u>Database:</u> There has to be an online portal for each State covering all aspects of this scheme and the data from these has to be transferred to the central portal on periodic basis. In case, any State/UT needs support, the Central Ministry will make the

portal available for their use.

- 6. All the State Governments/UT Admns. will announce in May-June, the details of the Scheme and invite applications by issuing an advertisement in the leading newspapers of the State and through other media outfits. All requests for application forms and other particulars should be addressed to the concerned State/UT to which students actually belong. The applicant should submit the completed application to the prescribed authority before the last date prescribed for receipt of applications.
- 7. Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT): All payments under the scheme, including the tuition fee reimbursement, would need to be made to the bank account of the student only, using the DBT system. Most of the States are already on DBT mode. All States/UTs are requested to make suitable arrangements for this purpose if not already done. No other form of payment should be acceptable under the scheme.

Central Assistance for the Scheme

8. The release of Central funds will be done to the State Government as per the following schedule as far as possible:

9. <u>Monitoring of the scheme:</u> The State Government shall set up a robust monitoring mechanism for monitoring the academic progress of the students enrolled to the scheme. The updated database shall be uploaded in the Central Servers every quarter which shows both the physical (details of the students paid) and financial (amount released) progress.
