Special Central Assistance to **Scheduled Castes** Sub-Plan.

Special Central Assistance (SCA) to Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan (SCSP)

Objective

- A central sector scheme, started in 1980, under which 100% grant is given to the States/UTs, as an additive to their Scheduled Castes Sub Plan (SCSP).
- The main objective is to :
 - i) give a thrust to family oriented schemes of economic development of SCs below the poverty line.
 - ii) Infrastructure development in villages with more than 50% SC population.

SCA to SCSP

SCA to States/UTs is released on the basis of the following criteria:

i)	SC Population of the States/UTs	40%
ii)	Relative backwardness of the States/UTs	10%
iii)	Percentage of SC families in the States/UTs covered by Composite economic development programmes in the State Plan to enable them to cross the poverty line.	25%
iv)	Percentage of SCP to the Annual Plan as compared to SC population percentage of the States/UTs.	25%

Salient features

- Amount of subsidy admissible under the scheme is 50% of the project cost, subject to a maximum of Rs. 10,000/ per beneficiary.
- Upto 10% of the total release to State/UT can be utilized for infrastructure development in villages having 50% or more SC population.
- At least 15% & 5% of the SCA to be utilized by States/UTs exclusively for Schemes/Programmes for SC women and PwDs, respectively.

Pre-Matric Scholarship for SC students studying in classes IX & X.

Pre-Matric Scholarship for SC students studying in Class IX and X

Objective

- New Centrally sponsored Scheme of Pre-Matric Scholarship for students belonging to Scheduled Castes studying in Classes IX & X, with effect from 01.07.2012.
- The objective of the Scheme is to support parents of SC children for education of their wards studying in classes IX and X so that the incidence of drop-out, especially in the transition from the elementary to the secondary stage is minimized.

Major features of the Scheme are as follows:-

A. For being eligible under this Scheme, the student should:-

- (i) Belong to Scheduled Caste and her/his Parent/Guardian's income should not exceed Rs. 2 lakh per annum.
- (ii) Should not be getting any other Centrally-funded Pre-Matric Scholarship.
- (iii) Should be a regular, full time student studying in a Government School or in a School recognized by Govt. or a Central/State Board of Secondary Education.

Scholarship for studying in any class will be available for only one year. If a student has to repeat a class, she/he would not get scholarship for that class for a second (or subsequent) year.

The object of the Scheme is to provide hostel facilities to SC Boys and Girls studying in middle schools, higher secondary schools, colleges and Universities.

Salient Features

- The State Governments/Union Territory Administrations and the Central & State Universities/institutions are eligible for central assistance, both for fresh construction of hostel buildings and for expansion of the existing hostel facilities.
- NGOs and deemed Universities in the private sector can avail the benefit only for expansion of their existing hostel facilities.

Important Issues

- States need to send the complete proposals in the prescribed format giving full details regarding the :
 - i) Blocks, locations of the proposed hostels etc. SC population in blocks, where the hostel is proposed. (Priority to be given to such blocks where SC population is 20% or more and where no hostels exist.)
 - ii) the physical & financial progress of previously sanctioned hostels must be furnished.
 - iii) Utilization Certificate for Central released sanctioned in the past.
 - iv) Supporting documents like land ownership, maintenance funds, fire-fighting, water-harvesting etc.
 - v) Justification to be given in case per inmate cost is less than or exceeds Rs. 2.00 lakh per inmate.

- ➤ The main objective of the scheme is to upgrade the merits of SC students by providing with facilities for all round development through education in Residential School.
 - a) Removing their educational deficiency.
 - b) Facilitating their entry into professional courses by upgrading their merit so that they can compete.
 - c) Admission to higher education courses.
 - d) Generating self confidence.

Scheduled Castes Development Corporations (SCDCs)

Scheduled Castes Development Corporations (SCDCs)

Objective

- The main functions of SCDCs include
 - i. identification of eligible SC families and
 - ii. motivating them to undertake economic development schemes,
- sponsoring the schemes to financial institutions for credit support,
- > providing financial assistance in the form of margin money at low rate of interest, and
- > subsidy in order to reduce the repayment liability and providing necessary tie up with other poverty alleviation programmes.

Contd...

- The SCDCs are playing an important role in providing credit and inputs by way of margin money loans and subsidy to the target group.
- ➤ The SCDCs finance employment oriented schemes cover:
 - (i) Agriculture and allied activities including minor Irrigation,
 - (ii) Small Scale Industry,
 - (iii) Transport, and
 - (iv) Trade and Service Sector. SCDCs finance projects by dovetailing loan component from NSFDC/banks along with margin money out of their own funds and subsidy out of Special Central Assistance (SCA) to Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan (SCSP).

SCDCs: Issues

Haryana

• The Share capital was released last time during 2010-11.

• Further, proposal not received from the Corporation.

Himachal Pradesh

• The Central Share capital of Rs.134.51 lakhs was released during 2012-13.

Punjab

• The Share capital of Rs.100 lakhs was released during 2012-13.

Tamil Nadu

- The Share capital was released last time during 2003-04.
- The Proposal for 2012-13 has been received but the Central Share of Capital could not be released to the Corporation as the paid up Share Capital of the Corporation has exceeded the authorized share capital. The Corporation has been requested to provide orders for enhancement of authorized share capital vide letter No. 17014/53/1999-SCD-IV dated 24.02.2012. Reminder issued on 24.08.2012 and 04.10.2012. The Corporation has been requested to clarify whether the waiver of loan by the State Government of Tamil Nadu has resulted in erosion of equity in general and Central Government contribution of the equity in particular vide letter dated 17.10.2012.

Uttarakhand

• The Central equity Share was released last time during 2004-05.

• No further proposal received from the Corporation

Chandigarh

- The Share capital was released last time during 2008-09.
- Proposal for the FY 2012-13 was received.
- Despite repeated letters, the Corporation did not submit the complete proposal in prescribed format.

Delhi

- The Share capital was released last time during 1997-98.
- The Corporation was requested to provide audited accounts for the last five years vide letter No. 17014/20/2001-SCD-IV dated 03.02.2011. The same are awaited despite reminder dated 8.6.2011, 3.8.2011 and 19.12.2011,24.04.12 and 4.10.2012.

Pradhan Mantri Adarsh Gram Yojana

- The Scheme is being implemented on Pilot basis in 5 States of the country.
- Government of Himachal Pradesh conveyed its concurrence to implement the Scheme in February, 2011 in 225 SC majority villages in Districts Sirmour and Solan.
- Full Central assistance @ Rs. 20.00 lakh per village has been released in favour of the States.
- The progress report to 31.03.2013 is awaited.

Survey of Manual Scavengers

- During the Socio-Economic Castes Census, data of manual scavengers is being captured.
- Ministry of SJ&E is steering and coordinating Survey of manual scavengers in 3546 statutory towns.
